XO Report Skip Roeder, S



Hello Crew,

Been nice and warm lately hasn't it? It always feels cooler when I'm on the water. Not much to report on the fishing front. I did have a fun day with Sandbar sharks about four miles out the ship channel in an area known as the flats. I got five to the boat that ranged from 30 to 80 pounds. One big one could not be stopped, and he parted my 65 pound test without slowing down.

The other day I was doing some trolling on the internet, and came across the USCG annual report on boating accidents. There's some great stats that


we should use when encouraging people to take a safe boating course or to wear a lifejacket. In 2013 there were 4062 accidents that resulted in 560 fatalities and 2620 injuries. Only 13% of the fatalities occurred on boats operated by someone with training in safe boating. Boats operated by persons that had Power Squadron training were only involved in 70 accidents, and accounted for only four of the 560 fatalities. Of the fatalities, 77% were by drowning. Of those, 84% were not wearing a lifejacket. Some facts to chew on. For something else to chew on, here's this month's recipe.

Creole Shrimp Curry

- 1/4 tsp. cumin
- ½ tsp. turmeric
- 1/4 tsp. ground coriander
- 1/4 tsp. cardamom
- ½ tsp. chili powder
- ¼ tsp. ground ginger
- 1/8 tsp cayenne
- ½ tsp. salt
- ¼ tsp black pepper

- 2 tlbs. Butter
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 1/3 cup chopped red and green bell pepper, combined
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 1 lb. lightly boiled, peeled shrimp-about 30 count size
- 1 tlbs. Lemon juice
- 1. Measure and combine all the spices through the black pepper.
- 2. In a large skillet over high heat, melt the butter and sauté the onion, bell peppers, garlic and the spice mixture until the onions are lightly browned.
- 3. Lower the heat to medium and add the cream. Bring to a boil, stirring now and then. Reduce by about one third.
- 4. Add the shrimp and lemon juice and simmer until the shrimp are heated through. Serve over rice.
