

#### December 2008 COW Vicky Jefferis, AP Secretary



Commander Charles Wilsdorf, SN, called the Meeting to order January 24, 2009 at 6:30 PM. Howard Klippel, AP, provided the Invocation and Larry Jefferis, AP, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commander Wilsdorf introduced George and Lila Eschelman, guests of the Klippels,

and Jim and Linda Mahoney, new Squadron

members. He explained his intent to conduct "nuts and bolts" business in the Executive Meeting, reporting to the General Membership with the goal of creating more time for fun and fellowship at the Membership meetings. All are encouraged to provide thoughts at any time. Secretary Vicky Jefferis, AP, summarized the earlier Executive Committee meeting:

By 1 February National requires the names of officers and committee chairs. All officers need to review the list and report changes. We need a Membership Chairperson –the Jefferis are asked to temporarily cover the job until we have a permanent fill. Teresa Wilsdorf will cover Membership Involvement.

The Squadron Website is ready. USPS will host it but can only allow each Squadron 10 megabytes of space, limiting its capability and requiring the local Squadron to do its own backups. Joe Scirica, Webmaster, suggests we get our own host, costing around \$100 annually. The committee decided to pay for our own site host because it would be far more useful to the Squadron. Next, the committee discussed the proposal for District to centrally host all District meetings in the future. The committee will support the preferences of the other squadrons to keep the status quo, but would like some discussion at the Spring District Conference.

Cdr. Wilsdorf asked for ideas about other locations for monthly meetings. The current location may be difficult to access when Interstate exchange construction gets underway soon and if the Squadron grows, the room may become too small.

Discussion turned to a new Squadron Roster. Normally it would be published in August, but since that's so late in the year; a new roster should be published in March.

The GISPS Bylaws have not been certified by National. The Rules Committee needs to review them and propose any changes for approval by the membership. Pat Rogers, Rules Committee, will be asked to do the review. Pat and John Rogers agreed to review the GISPS Bylaws as requested.

Cdr. Wilsdorf suggested we invite speakers to our meetings occasionally. Anyone having ideas should pass the information to Steve Batson, Admin Officer. We also want to promote the social aspects we can enjoy through participating in Squadron activities. For

example, we all had a great time at Richard and Dorothy Jones' shrimp boil. Please suggest ideas for more social activities.

Cdr. Wilsdorf also suggested the Squadron consider partnering with local businesses for mutual benefits – we get more publicity and so do the businesses. Perhaps we can advertise for them at little or no cost and get support in return. John Rogers suggested the Squadron contact Barney at the Golden Isles Marina Ships Store to investigate potential for mutual partnership.

Finally, Cdr. Wilsdorf announced to the Executive Committee that our Squadron insurance is in place, therefore any issues arising from a Squadron sponsored activity is covered. He also mentioned that the USPS will cost share advertising expense with us through the Co-Op Advertising program.

Cdr Wilsdorf presented the 2008 Member of the Year Award to Bob Woodman, P. Bob's efforts as Executive Officer, helping with boat shows, Coast Fest and educational activities, and conducting courtesy boat inspections were instrumental in helping make 2008 a successful year for GISPS. Charles also announced that Bob has recently joined the electronic world and now has email!

The Minutes from the December Change of Watch were approved.

Bridge Officer Reports: Executive Officer Larry Jefferis asked for committee volunteers. The open committees and a description of them are in the January Porthole. Steve Batson, P, Administrative Officer, also asked for committee volunteers and invited all to provide ideas for programs for meetings. Teresa Wilsdorf, S, presented

the Treasurer's Report: 2008 Income totaled \$5,152.38. Expenses totaled \$4,310.76. Bank Balance 12/31/2008 is \$1,578.78. Vicky Jefferis read the Education Officer's Report: Thanks to Cdr. Wilsdorf for teaching the ongoing Weather class to six students. Steve Batson will soon take the AP exam. P/C Audie Holmes will present BoatSmart 28 February at the UGA Marine Extension Service Location.

Other Business: The Executive Committee accepted the USPS Annual Billing proposal. This new cycle will save money and will simplify dues collecting for the Squadron. Cost of dues will remain the same. Members will write checks to USPS and National will forward our portion to GISPS. Cdr. Wilsdorf encouraged all present to remember the Power of One program – new members will make our Squadron even more vital and fun. He asked members to submit articles and photos to Joe Scirica for our new Website. BoatSmart and the next meeting will be Saturday February 28.

Bob Woodard moved to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 7:30 PM.

Finally, a bit of liaison news from the Kings Bay Periscope:

When people in the Kings Bay area hear the words Sea Dragon they might think of the submarine USS Sea Dragon, which traveled more than 200,000 miles during its 24-year career and submerged more than 1800 times. Decommissioned June 12, 1983, she left service with 13 deployments and four under ice operations.

"The Sea Dragon name has a historic linage, and its transition is amazing," said Congressman Jack Kingston R- Ga., District One. "It goes from a naval submarine to a Coast Guard cutter that protects nuclear submarines."

On Jan. 14, the legacy of the Sea Dragon came back to life with the commissioning of the United States Coast Guard Cutter Sea Dragon. The Sea Dragon measures in at 84 feet long and an official crew size of 15 members. It is part of the Marine Protector Class of boats constructed by Bollinger Ship Yards of Lockport. Assigned to the Marine Protection Unit at Kings Bay, the Sea Dragon will be a single-mission unit designed to protect submarines coming into or out of Kings Bay. By 2010, there will be ten boats used by the MFPU to protect and secure the waterways while submarines transit to and from Kings Bay. The Transit Protection Program will consist of two cutters and 12 costal patrol boats that range in size from 33 feet to 65 feet.

Sea turtles live in the same environment in which we boat. That can provide challenges to the turtles and us. I hope each of you will join us at La Fuento de Pablo's for this exciting and relevant program. This will be a good night to invite guests and prospective members!

Also, note on your calendar the date of February 28 at 9:00 a.m. for Boat Smart at the UGA Extension Center in Brunswick.
