To celebrate the fall season, here is one of our favorites. Save it for the first chilly weather.

Bavarian Beef Stew

This is easy, low calorie and convenient as well as good.

3-4 lbs. chuck roast cubed 1 tbls. salt

1 can cream of mushroom soup ½ tsp. pepper

¼ cup red wine vinegar3 bay leaves2 tlbs. Worcestershire sauce4 large onions, quartered

½ tsp. dry mustard 1 cup water

1/2 cup red wine 1 lb. baby carrots

½ tsp. thyme 5 large potatoes, cut up

1 tsp. sweet basil leaves ½ lb. baby bella mushrooms, chopped

1 tsp. Season All

Mix beef and vegetables in a Dutch oven. Mix all other ingredients in a large measuring cup and pour over vegetables. Cover and bake at 275 for five hours. The stew creates its own gravy.


Treasurer's Report Teresa Wilsdorf, S
