There has been much information written lately on personal floatation devices (lifejackets). America's Boating Club has been encouraging the proper use of lifejackets since their inception. It seems like every boating publication I pick up has an article on lifejackets. Of these articles, subjects range from when to wear a lifejacket, what size, what type, children's lifejackets, lifejacket laws, how to maintain a lifejacket, doggie lifejackets, and trying out your lifejacket in the water. This last one is very important. Will your lifejacket keep your face out of the water, will it turn you on your back or on your stomach, did it inflate properly (inflatables), is it comfortable in the water, will it stay on in the water, can you swim in your lifejacket. How many of you have actually tried your lifejacket in the water? Boaters were wearing their lifejackets in 13% of all boating related drownings since 2004. I think it is time I try my lifeiacket in the water. How about you? By the way, America's Boating Channel has a new video on children's lifejackets (http://americasboatingchannel.com/video/life-jacketsfor-children/).

Sharon reminded us of the Litter Pick-Up at Lanier Park at 9:00 am on September 8.


