Commander's Message

Many thanks to the hard and time-consuming work by Sharon and Teresa.

To be on the safe side, our Sep 29 cruise to Two Way, was cancelled due to the forecast of rain and thunderstorms. Still, without keeping a time schedule and staying relatively close to departure points, many of us were able to get on the water for a while. Mike Moye, N and Sharon Moye, S along with Braxton Sorg, AP Hilarie Brush, P, Teresa, and myself were able to do a little Coop Charting checking ICW Aids to Navigation (ATONs) in Jekyll Creek. As you well know, boating is always an adventure as our boat, Topwater, went aground at ICW Beacon #6. This grounding might have been avoided if I had studied the chart closer and had been focused on where we were going rather than looking at the Light List. The noise from the bottom of the boat and then the engine was excruciating. Well, my boat wasn't holed, and seemed to perform as usual. I knew I was going to see a long gash in the bottom and a bent or nicked propeller, but upon inspection at the loading hoist all looked good and no fiberglass or prop repair in the future. Boy, was I lucky. I am afraid Teresa would have taken my boat keys away. I don't know why I always have to learn the hard way. Inspect your charts closely and look where you are going. Where have I heard that before?

GPS Failure

While researching GPS system failures for the new Navigation II course, I ran across an article in The Atlantic magazine which describes what can happen if the GPS network of satellites have a failure.

We all think of the GPS as a device to locate our position, but in fact, it serves another function, which today is more important than its location function. The GPS system provides time synchronization for telecom networks, electrical power grids, banking (ATM, Credit Cards), market transactions, Doppler radar, digital TV and radio, and other areas.

Have there been failures, yes. The system failed in January of 2016 when a satellite was taken offline and an incorrect time was uploaded into several other satellites. It was twelve hours later before the correction could be made. If the problem had gone much longer, it would have been a major catastrophe. In many cases private short-term backup systems averted problems, but in North America many fire, police, and EMS department's radios were affected.

The bottom line is the government needs a backup time system, which they have been studying for the last 15 years. I encourage you to read the article at http://www.theatlantic.com/technology/archive/2016/06/what-happens-if-gps-fails/486824/.



September 18, 2018 Excom Meeting

Those attending were Treasurer Teresa Wilsdorf, S; AO Rick Hindery, P; P/C Sharon Hindery, AP; Secretary Margaret Butler, SN; Bob Butler, SN; P/C Vicky Jefferis, JN; XO Ed Reynolds, S; and Joe Stortz, AP. Not present was SEO Paul Truelove, SN.

Sharon and Teresa reported that credit card usage is available through PayPal. They discussed that our website is being set up to permit the ordering of name tags and to pay for classes and textbooks.

Vicky is attending the District Fall Conference.

Our ABC class is being held on October 20. For advertising, Ed will place posters on St. Simons Island. Rick and Sharon will place posters in downtown Brunswick. Paul will handle Jekyll. Ed is working with Morningstar Marina for more extensive advertising there as well as with the Freedom Boat Club. Sharon will contact the newspaper for inclusion in the Community Calendar. We will also research radio coverage.

Our October meeting will be held at the Newcastle site of the International Seafarer's Center. Dinner will be catered by Grandy's. Rick will communicate costs and the RSVP time table. We hope there will be a ship in port which we can tour. If so, we will invite seafarers to join us for dinner. Sharon made a motion, and Vicky seconded, that the Club pay for dinner for any seafarers. Motion passed.

Margaret reviewed the current status of registering America's Boating Club Golden Isles as our trade name or trade/service mark. Vicky feels this subject will be discussed at Fall Conference and she will report back to us.

Ed reported that Freedom Boat Club is being set up at Morningstar Marina. They have indicated an interest in working with us, promoting our educational programs. The committee agreed to put their advertisement in our "Porthole" at no charge.

A local cruise is planned for September 29. Ed, Charles and Cindy have cruised the route up the McKay River to Mud Cat Charlie's and have reserved a room there for lunch. We may be able to do some co-op charting on that trip. Ed is working up a Float Plan.

Vicky presented the nominating committee's slate of officers for the coming year. Charles directed the secretary to email the new slate of officers to all members.

We agreed to print more tri-fold brochures about our Club to share with the Freedom Boat Club and to use at Coastfest.

The Visual Trainer is on the way for us to use at Coastfest. Charles will set it up at his home and perhaps members can come by and use it.

We decided not to publish a December "Porthole." We will publish a December/January issue in January.

We reviewed the Merit Mark list provided by the Commander and agreed with his recommendations.



Quarterly Litter Pick-up






