Also remember that your children or grandchildren born after 1998 require this course in order to pilot a boat. Please encourage your boating friends to attend.

ICW Dredging Slated for Georgia (Excerpted from AIWA eNews)

The highest non-disaster amount in years for maintaining the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) was awarded the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for 2019: a total of \$23.9 million. See the table below for the huge funding increase earmarked for Georgia waterways as compared to other states. A number of waterway maintenance projects are underway along "Marine Highway 95" this month in Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida, with projects on the horizon for Georgia.

The Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway Association (AIWA) is a leader in the growing group of stakeholders who fund, maintain and advocate for the Atlantic ICW. One of the AIWA priorities is defining projects that more creatively manage dredge material. In many areas of the ICW, upland disposal sites are becoming filled to capacity. The state of Florida is currently the only area with enough capacity for the next 10-20 years.

Recently a dredging contract was awarded to remove material from the ICW in Jekyll Creek, Georgia. Some of the dredge material will be used beneficially ("more creatively") on the northern end of Jekyll Island in a pilot project to restore and enhance existing marsh. The project's design will be monitored for success by multiple stakeholders for potential future use along other segments of the ICW. The work should begin as early as this spring 2019.

Federal Funding Table for FY18 and FY 19

The Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway received over \$23 million in federal funding for FY 19. Below is a comparison of federal funding compared with FY18. Disaster supplemental funding is not included for comparison, but totaled over \$24 million in FY18 for a total of over \$60 million in federal funding in FY18 and FY19.

Squadron Education Officer Report

Remember Y2K? It was real and caused a few problems—but for most of us it was just bluster. I don't think anyone has given the impending problem a catchy name yet, but our Global Positioning System (GPS) units could possibly be in trouble. It all has to do with a date rollover similar to the rollover to January I, 2000 with computers.

The GPS satellites provide timing information for lots of applications around the world. Many are critical—such as information for power grids and emergency services. Location information for boats, cars, and airplanes is pretty important too. Basically, the satellites provide date and time by giving information on the current week and the number of seconds into that week. As we know from our Celestial Navigation courses—that's critical information when it comes to determining your location. The GPS units must have absolutely accurate time to be able to make location calculations.

Within the firmware of your GPS is a field representing the week and seconds. It is written as a 10-bit binary number supplied to your GPS by multiple satellites. The fact that the code is written this way limits the range of the number to a total of 1024 weeks—almost 20 years. Our GPS system kicked off on January 6, 1980. The first 20 years of weeks ran out on August 21, 1999 and the counter reset to zero. The next roll over to zero is April 6, 2019. (I checked Furuno's web site and they say March 17 for their units.) The rollover worked fine in 1999 so why should we be concerned about 2019? Frankly, you probably don't have anything to worry about if your GPS receiver is newer or if you are receiving firmware updates to your older units. Some of us probably should worry though. If your GPS unit has not had firmware updates in 10-15 years, frankly you might want to be a little concerned if you're out in your boat on April 6 and find yourself in a maior fog while trying to find the entrance to St. Simons Sound.

I'm not an electronics guru and most likely could not perform the testing procedures, but there are simulation programs that can be used to test your unit. Critical users of GPS systems are most likely doing testing to make sure their units are going to be fine. But this rollover event is a very real threat to some older units. For more information I'd suggest checking the website for the manufacturer of your equipment. Some have identified units that will be OK, however, they will also tell you to be careful on that date and check the accu-

racy of your unit. Some sites will also say the problem could occur long after April 6. So, what do we do that day? One blogger said that he was going to put fresh batteries in his Radio Direction Finder (bet many of you have never heard of an RDF!). Another said that his answer was going to be posting a crew member by the anchor. I think My Sharona and I will just stay tied to the dock...


